Diversity, Equality and Inclusion Charter and Guidelines for Early Childhood Care and Education.

Sligo County Childcare Committee will continue with the rollout of the training programme on Equality, Diversity and Inclusion as part of the **Access and Inclusion Model (AIM)** This training programme is funded under the AIM Model and is therefore free of charge to all staff working under the **ECCE Programme only**.



The goal of AIM is to empower Early Years service providers to deliver an inclusive preschool experience, ensuring that every child can fully participate in the ECCE Programme and reap the benefits of quality early years care and education.

In order to incorporate a deeper level of understanding around the subject of Diversity, Equality and Inclusion for all staff and to assist in meeting some of the challenges which it will pose, Sligo County Childcare Committee will support services through the proposed training programme which is now being delivered nationally.

The first training programme will take place in the Sligo County Childcare Committee training room as detailed on the calendar and the dates for all training can be viewed overleaf.

Over four sessions the programme will explore the following:

- Using the Diversity, Equality and Inclusion Charter and Guidelines to support practice in ECCE terminology and concepts relating to Diversity, Equality and Inclusion
- Looking at our attitudes and values Anti-Bias approach
- Policy, Legislation and Guidelines Equality Proofing the ECEC environment
- Exploring issues and challenges leadership relating to Diversity, Equality and Inclusion

The sector is currently in receipt of high level investment under the AIM Model and the impact of this will be reflected in the quality of our services. Quality is of course assessed through the inspection mechanisms that the sector is subject to and this training will support you in meeting the requirements under these inspections.

The initiative has two strands. The first strand focuses on Síolta, including a suite of "Síolta Awareness Raising Workshops" and the expansion of the "Síolta Quality Assurance Programme" (QAP). The second strand relates to Aistear, and includes the development of workshops and coaching to support practitioners to use Aistear in their setting.

Sligo County Childcare will deliver a number of workshops under the **National Siolta Aistear Initiative** in Autumn 2017. This will include workshops in relation to Siolta and Aistear, see details below:

Siolta Aistear Introductory Workshop:

- This workshop is suitable for participants who would like to become familiar with Siolta the National Quality Framework and Aistear the National Curriculum Framework.
- Participants will also be introduced to the Aistear Siolta Practice Guide and what it has to offer the Children in their care.
- It will help learners become more familiar with ways to link the curriculum they provide to Aistear and Siolta.
- It will help services reflect upon their curriculum and ways in which it can be enhanced.
- Staff members who complete this training will be eligible for 10 hours Aistear Initiative workshops when launched in 2018.

<u>Sligo CCC will also host a specific Siolta Aistear Introductory workshop for Childminders in Sligo on</u> October 12th

Siolta Awareness raising Workshops:

This is a suite of 4 workshops, each workshop focuses on a cluster of Siolta strands which are similar or link closely together. Please note each workshop complements the other workshops in the suite, but attending all 4 is not essential.

- <u>Workshop A Management</u> : will look at Siolta standards 4: Consultation, 8: Planning & Evaluation, 9: Health & Welfare, 10: Organisation, 11: Professional Practice,12: Communication and 15: Legislation & Regulation.
- <u>Workshop B Early Years Practice</u> : includes standards 2: Environments, 6: Play and 7: Curriculum.
- <u>Workshop C Interactions & Relationships:</u> will look at standards 1: Rights of the Child, 3: Parents and Families, 4: Consultation and 5: Interactions
- <u>Workshop D Identity and Community:</u> includes standards 13: Transitions, 14: Identity & belonging and 16: CommunityInvolvement.

Siolta Quality Assurance Programme:

This suite of workshops will be followed by an information session for services interested in engaging with the Siolta Quality Assurance Programme. The Siolta Quality Assurance Programme supports Early Years Services to go through the process of becoming Siolta validated.

Why is it important for you as a practitioner to engage in Continuing Professional Development ?

The Childcare Sector has undergone and continues to undergo huge changes and development over the past number of years. Practitioners who engage in Continuing Professional Development also find that it supports them to reflect and enhance their funds of knowledge on different and emerging research and theories relating to approaches and practices in the Early Years sector.

This also demonstrates to parents and other relevant professionals their commitment and professionalism to the care and education of children they engage with on a daily basis and gives them opportunity to reflect on their practice:

- Consider what you do?
- Why do you do what you do?
- How could you do it better ?
- Reflect and evaluate who you are and what you are doing.

Sligo County Childcare aim to provide events which will meet the needs identified by you - the Early Years Professional. Training will be a combination of theory and practical application throughout.
